Widely recognized as the state of the art in law enforcement driver training, the Guide and its periodic updates are available to all IADLEST member states. The most recent update includes revisions to the legal block of instruction, student performance exercises, and other improvements.

Coordination of IADLEST Criminal Justice Data

IADLEST is seeking to coordinate the collection and dissemination of criminal justice data that its members accumulate. The most important aspect of this project is the publication of the "Sourcebook." The Sourcebook provides descriptive and statistical information regarding state law enforcement training and standards, as well as reports regarding special studies.

Model Minimum State Standards

As a national association of training managers, IADLEST feels a responsibility to "set a floor" on officer professionalism. Accordingly, it recommends model minimum state standards in the following areas:

1. entry level standards
2. basic training
3. in-service requirements
4. discipline and decertification; and
5. curriculum issues for criminal justice officers.

Director: This is an agency membership available to the director or chief executive officer of any board, council, commission, or other policy making body, which is established and empowered by state law and possesses sole statewide authority and responsibility for the development and implementation of minimum standards and/or training for law enforcement, and where appropriate, correctional personnel.

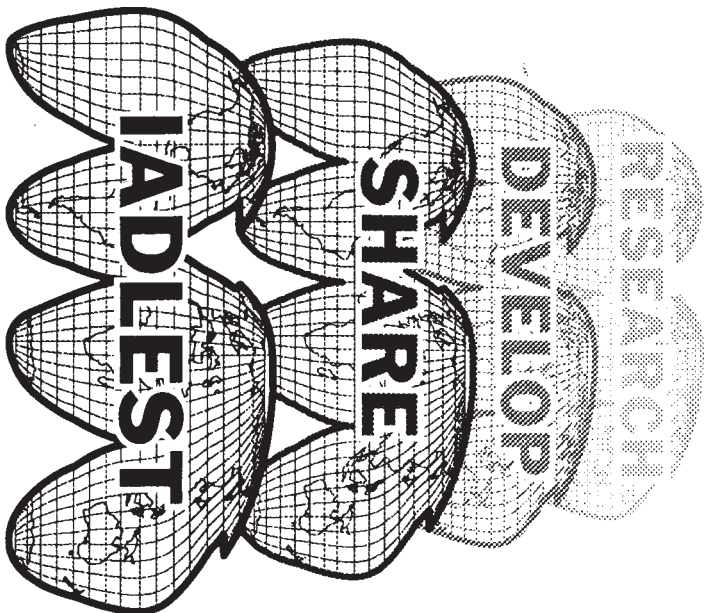
General Member: General membership is available to any professional employee or member of an agency headed by a director, a criminal justice academy, board, council or other policy-making body, or foreign equivalent, who is actively engaged in the training/education of law enforcement, and where appropriate, correctional personnel.

Sustaining Member: Sustaining membership is limited to any individual, partnership, foundation, corporation, or other entity involved directly or indirectly with the development or training of law enforcement or other criminal justice personnel.

General and sustaining members must have the sponsorship of the director upon application for membership.
