IADLEST and VirTra Award Atoka Police Department with a Free Simulator as Part of Taskforce Santa Project

December 14, 2023, The International Association of Directors in Law Enforcement Standards and Training (IADLEST) and VirTra (Nasdaq: VTSI) have announced the selection for the Taskforce Santa project, which provides a public safety training simulator to a deserving agency free of charge. On December 13, Atoka Police Department in Tennessee received its V-100® training simulator after being selected from over one hundred applicants nationwide.

After installing the simulator, a press conference was held at the police department. Atoka Mayor Barry Akin, Atoka Police Chief Anthony Rudolph, and VirTra CEO John Givens spoke to the dozens of attendees. Each expressed gratitude for the partnership and overwhelming support for the police and community of Atoka. When speeches and addresses concluded, scenarios were demonstrated for attendees to view.

All VirTra's simulators include coursework that is NCP certified by IADLEST, ensuring that the best training value is gleaned from the content. Throughout the event, each person from the police department and the city of Atoka placed great value on training. "Training for all of our staff is so important, we put a great emphasis on it" said Mayor Akin. "This is truly a historic event for Atoka."

Stories and nominations were sent in from law enforcement agencies and civilians from around the country, showing the vast need for training and funding. Atoka Police Department's story stood out as they listed heartfelt reasons why they could use the VirTra system: community engagement and education, enhancing officer safety and wellness and mutual aid/collaboration with other small local agencies.

CEO John Givens echoed these sentiments, expressing his hope that the gift will enhance the town's safety and: "In the true spirit of Christmas, we hope this gift will keep this community and its great officers safer than they are today through realistic training."

Atoka Police Department received the V-100 simulator, its training software, NCP-certified coursework, less lethal tools, and a full year of service and warranty. Additionally, shipping company Pilot offered to ship the system from Chandler, Arizona to Atoka for free after hearing the story in the spirit of giving.

IADLEST is a nonprofit and is looking forward to partnering with VirTra in the future for similar events to bring effective training to agencies in need.
