Byron Zlateff has ten years of law enforcement instructional experience.

He began his law enforcement career in April 2006, with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (LVMPD). In 2009, Byron became a Field Training Officer and a Defensive Tactics instructor. He was an Academy Instructor from 2009-2011. In 2010, he was provided the opportunity to assist in the Advanced Officer Scenario Training (AOST) as a role player in scenes; ensuring the officers had the correct stimulus to react accordingly; adhering to performance objectives. Byron continued his scenario instructional assistance with the Police Officer Standards Training (POST) Academy at LVMPD.

In May 2011, Byron transferred to the Spokane County Sheriff's Office in the State of Washington. He has continued his expertise as a Field Training Officer beginning 2013 through the present. Byron became certified as an Instructor through the Washington Criminal Justice Training Commission in 2013. That year, Byron became a Patrol Procedures instructor, and, in 2014, the lead Reality Based Instructor. Byron has created curriculum and regularly instructs for his agency's quarterly In-Service training. For the past two years, Byron has assisted with the annual training courses presented by the Department of Emergency Management, Eastern Washington University, Spokane Valley Fire Department and Emergency Medical Services, providing both lecture and scenario-based training (RBT). Since 2014, Byron has instructed Patrol Procedures at the Basic Law Enforcement Academy (BLEA) for Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission (WOTC) in Spokane, Washington.
