Jim McGregor started his law enforcement career in 1998. He holds a Master Peace Officer proficiency certificate from the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement. He has a TCOLE Advanced Instructor proficiency certification and holds instructor certifications in multiple law enforcement disciplines such as firearms instruction, reality-based training, field sobriety testing, Taser, de-escalation, ethics, driving, and intellectual and developmental disability recognition. Mr. McGregor holds master's degrees in organizational management and criminal justice. During his 24-year career, he has worked as a patrol officer, SWAT entry team member and designated marksman, field training officer, firearms instructor, and reality-based training instructor.
