Justin Elliot is a Sergeant with the Spokane County Sheriff's Office, in the State of Washington. He has 20 years of law enforcement experience. He has fifteen years of Uniformed Patrol experience assigned to districts and specialized enforcement units with two agencies. Sergeant Elliott holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Criminal Justice Management. Sergeant Elliott has five years' experience as a Detective, with experience in general investigations, major narcotics and major crimes. In 2015, he was promoted to the rank of Sergeant assigned to the Patrol Division and the Training Unit/Field Training and Evaluation Program as a supervisor.

Through the Instructor Certification Program of Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission (WSCJTC), Sergeant Elliott has been a Field Training Officer Academy Instructor since 2009. Additionally, he has served as an instructor in Patrol Procedures and Criminal Procedures for the Spokane County Sheriff's Office and the WSCJTC Basic Law Enforcement Academy. Sergeant Elliott is well-versed in curricula development. Sergeant Elliott oversees his department's Field Training and Evaluation Program, while assisting the agency administration of the basic law enforcement training. He supervises more than twenty deputy sheriff trainers as field and classroom instructors. When requested by the Sheriff, He provides written opinions and expert testimony regarding various law enforcement training and procedures.

As a member of the Washington State Chapter of the National Field Training Officers Association (NAFTO), Sergeant Elliott has served as a Regional Director since 2015. In this role, he regularly assists other agencies in coordination of advanced training, and providing information for improving agencies' training curricula and program structure. He was awarded Master Field Training Officer Certification by the National Board in 2018. Sergeant Elliott also received the FBI-LEEDA Trilogy Award in 2015.
