

## Randall “Randy” Stickle

Randall Stickle is an intelligence Specialist at the National White Collar Crime Center (NW3C). He currently instructs the Foundations of Intelligence Analysis Training (FIAT), Introduction to Link Analysis (ILA), and Intelligence Writing and Briefing (IWAB) courses. Moreover, Randy supports agencies through various forms of intelligence-related technical assistance, liaises between partners and members at all levels, and manages content updates for the Law Enforcement Cyber Center (LECC).

Prior to joining NW3C, Randy served in various analytical roles in support of national security, law enforcement and public safety, as well as private industry. Most recently, Randy was the supervising developing intelligence/data analysis capabilities to mitigate the regional impact of the drug crisis as well as precipitous and analogous crimes in Northern West Virginia. Before joining TIPS, Randy was one of the initial intelligence analysts working the joint Mylan Pharmaceuticals and G4S Secure Solutions intelligence operations center, tasked with providing informational briefs and intelligence assessments for corporate security and executives. Prior to that, he was an intelligence analyst with the Open Source Intelligence Exchange (OSIX) responsible for open source analysis of key national security issues from the Middle East-North Africa region.

In addition to his current duties, Randy is an acting Fusion Liaison Officer (FLO) for the West Virginia Fusion Center and is a member of the National Fusion Center Association’s Analyst Council’s Training and Tradecraft Subcommittees. Moreover, Randy maintains membership with the West Virginia Human Trafficking Task Force, the International Association of Law Enforcement Intelligence Analysts (IALEIA), and the International Association of Crime Analysts (IACA), as well as the vice presidency of the National Security and Intelligence Alumni Association of Fairmont, Ltd (NSIAA).

Randy maintains industry certifications to demonstrate commitment to upholding law enforcement, public safety, and overall national security including Certified Cyber Crime Investigator (3CI) and Certified Economic Crime Forensic Examiner (CECFE) through NW3C.
