

Shawn Walker

Shawn Walker is the co-owner of KnS Equine Systema Farm LLC. A Georgia based company that provides equine services, personal health & wellness training, and management services. Mr. Walker provides law enforcement instruction services on topics of leadership, control tactics, firearms, physical fitness, and patrol tactics to include reduced light and active shooter tactics. He provides consulting services in the way of lesson plan development/review, policy development/review, tribal law enforcement relations, and police department development. Mr. Walker is a member of the Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation and a military veteran.

Mr. Walker began his law enforcement career in 1996, with the Kickapoo Nation as a tribal police officer and advanced to assistant chief after finishing his Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice from Washburn University. In 1997, he went to work for his tribe, the Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation as a tribal police officer and advanced to the rank of sergeant. While there, Mr. Walker helped to develop the department from a three-officer operation to 12 tribal police officers and dispatch center. In 1998, he began his involvement with law enforcement training which started with firearms and later included control tactics. In 1999, Mr. Walker joined the Mission Police Department, in a suburb of Kansas City, Kansas. Then, in 2009, he went to work for DynCorp International as police mentor in Afghanistan with their Border Police.

In 2012, Mr. Walker became the Chief of Police for the City of Pleasanton, Kansas. While there, he improved the school security program and assisted with the city's airport project. In 2013, Mr. Walker returned to his tribe, the Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation as their Chief of Police. While there, he rebuilt the relationship with the Nation's community, the sheriff department, and the Nation's casino.

In 2015, Mr. Walker started working as a Regional Coordinator for the State, Local & Tribal Division (SLTD) at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC). He is responsible for exporting FLETC training programs to state, local and tribal law enforcement agencies within his assigned region. Mr. Walker's area covers Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, South and North Dakota, Wyoming, Montana and Alaska. Mr. Walker is a Blue Courage Master Instructor and provides instruction for the Blue Courage program to FLETC and TSA staff.

While at FLETC, Mr. Walker finished his Masters of Business Degree in Change Management from Friends University. He does missionary missions to Honduran to help deliver law enforcement training at the National Police Academy in Comayagua.

In 2012, Mr. Walker had retired from the Kansas Army National Guard. While serving in the National Guard, he had two tours in Iraq and one in Bosnia & Herzegovina. He was responsible for jet engine maintenance, maintenance operations for 12 aircraft which supported medical operations for the southern half of Iraq, oversaw helicopter recovery operations, and was accountable for over 28 million dollars in parts and equipment related to aircraft operations.
