Tony Moore is a Detective and 20 year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. He's served in several assignments including the Information Bureau and currently in the Criminal Intelligence Bureau. Moore has been honing his expertise in the cyber world and is a recognized expert on social media investigations, cryptocurrencies, and emerging internet trends and holds Basic and Intermediate Instructor Certifications with California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST).

He introduced new technology in the form of geographically mapping of social media data, self-contained networks, and the use of deep-web technologies to investigate crimes. Through this he has shown members of law enforcement a better way to conduct investigations on cyber and social media related crimes.

Moore has developed and instructed classes on social media, internet investigations, Cryptocurrencies, public information and computer forensics via the California Department of Justice (CADOJ), DEA - Federal Law Enforcement Analysts Training (FLEAT), University of California, Irvine (UCI), and University of Southern California (USC) Viterbi School of Engineering. In 2013 he was a student in the inaugural class of the world's first accredited online cryptocurrency course where he earned a Certificate of Completion through the University of Nicosia, Cyprus.

Moore has lectured and been on panels at over 50 internationally recognized conferences including the International Association Chiefs of Police Conference (IACP); Social Media, Internet and Law Enforcement Conference (SMILE), National Black Police Officers Association and California District Attorneys Association (CDAA). He is also a member of the Microsoft Southern California Law Enforcement Group.

In 2016, Tony received the Instructor of the Year Award for "Individual Excellence in Law Enforcement Training" by the California Peace Officers Standards and Training Commission (POST), and was a recipient of the United States Attorney General's, Law Enforcement Award. He was also listed as one of the Top 100 Most Influential Blockchain Insiders, according to Richtopia.com
