Brian Grisham, Esq. is the Deputy Director of the International Association of Directors of Law Enforcement Standards and Training (IADLEST) and has been a member since 1998. In 2016 he was elected President and has served on the executive board for many years. He retired as the longest-serving Director of the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy (TLETA) and Executive Secretary of the Tennessee Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Commission in January of 2022 having served in those roles since April 2005.
