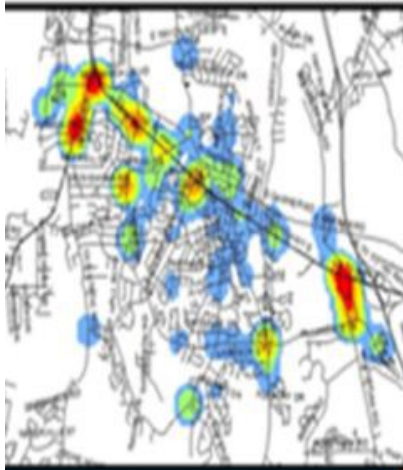


BJA Building Analytical Capacity Crime Analysis Webinar Recordings
